Our University is internationally recognised as a centre of excellence in a wide range of disciplines and we are known for the quality of our postgraduate teaching and research. We have more than 5,000 taught postgraduate students and 2,000 research postgraduates. Students come from over 130 countries to enjoy the benefits of our outstanding resources, including one of this country's leading academic research libraries, and high-quality laboratories and computing facilities.

Our approach to academic excellence

Integrating research with learning and teaching is at the heart of our strategy. Study here and you will be taught by staff who are engaged in world-class research and cutting edge professional practice. Our postgraduate teaching programmes are underpinned by this research, meaning you will have the opportunity to learn about the research process and experience how new knowledge is created. In the most recent Research Assessment Exercise (which assesses the quality of research in universities and colleges in the UK) more than half our schools were ranked in the top 10 in the country, including Electronic and Electrical Engineering (ranked the best in the country), Italian, English, Food Science and Education, to name just a few. 61% of our research was judged to be 'world leading' or 'internationally excellent' with a further 32.5% of 'national importance'.

The inspectors

The Quality Assurance Agency (QAA), which safeguards and helps improve the academic standards and quality of higher education in the UK, gave the University the highest category of praise available in their most recent audit. Their report highlights particular areas of excellence, including our research-led teaching, and the consistent use of the University's strategy to enhance teaching quality and standards.

Sixteen of our staff have been awarded National Teaching Fellowships by the Higher Education Academy in recognition of their innovative learning and teaching methods. That's more than any other English university – reflecting the excellence of our teaching.

Our students

We have performed consistently well in the National Student Survey. In the latest survey, 82% of undergraduate students who took part said they were very satisfied or satisfied with their experience at Leeds.

An International University

The University of Leeds is a truly international university. We have links with over 600 institutions worldwide and over 5,000 international students study with us each year. Our single-site campus is conveniently located, a short 10 minute walk to the city centre providing access to a vibrant city life and excellent local services and facilities. The city boasts a lively arts and entertainment scene and hosts a wide variety of shopping facilities.

Academic excellence is at the heart of our university strategy, and internationalisation is key to that. We take an international view of everything we do, whether that is welcoming students from other countries, or developing relationships with other universities and businesses around the world. This theme is embedded within our education, research and enterprise activities. We continue to develop long-term relationships with partner institutions, stakeholders and our graduates across the world, all of which benefits our students.

We maximise the impact of our research and innovation through international strategic collaborations. We play a key role in a number of major international networks of worldclass research universities and have developed significant international links through our academic schools and faculties.

Currently the University is undertaking research on 130 projects globally (outside the EU); worth £17.5m of grants from 98 different funding bodies. As well as collaborations with the Worldwide Universities Network (see below) the University receives research grants from a number of organisations in North America including the US Department of Agriculture, the Federal Aviation Administration and the National Institute of Health which is funding 13 different research projects worth over £2m.

Leeds and the Worldwide Universities Network

The University of Leeds is a founding member of this network of 16 world leading public research intensive universities from 5 continents. The WUN has three US partners.

The WUN Foundation provides support and a structure that underpins the Network and the secretariat is based in Leeds.

The University of Leeds has extensive collaborative relationship with each of our WUN US partners across a wide range of disciplines. Leeds have had over 40 research projects with US WUN partners since 2001 and have facilitated over 80 research visits by Leeds research staff and PGR students. Current key priority research areas are the Global Challenges which are collections of high quality WUN collaborative research programmes – each involving a number of WUN and other world-leading academic partners in the programme area – which are expected to contribute significantly to addressing the issues of global significance identified in the Challenges. The current challenges are:

- Adapting to Climate Change
- Global Public Health: Non-Communicable Disease
- Global Higher Education & Research
- Understanding Cultures

A popular university for international students

The University of Leeds is one of the most popular destinations in the UK for high-quality international students, with over 5,000 students from outside the UK choosing to study here.
