Support for all students is available from the full-time International Students' Officer in the Students' Union and from dedicated staff in the Department of Student Services. Numerous national, sporting and social societies all contribute to the Students' Union consistently being voted one of the best in the UK.

Subject areas in which we are considered to be a UK and international leader in terms of both research and teaching include:

Politics

Our Department of Politics has a distinguished history in graduate teaching and an international reputation for research excellence, and is one of the most vibrant and successful centres for teaching and research in Politics in the UK. The results of the 2008 Research Assessment Exercise (RAE) confirm the Department's status as a world class centre for the study of politics. The detailed assessment of the quality of published outputs and research environment ranked the Department first equal amongst all politics departments in the UK with 75% of research graded in the top 4* (world leading) and 3* (internationally excellent) categories. Key courses include MA in Politics, MA in Political Theory, MA in International Studies, MA in International Political Economy and MA in Governance and Public Policy .

Law

Research is at the heart of the School of Law's mission and takes in all areas of legal, socio-legal and criminological scholarship. The academic staff in the School of Law are known internationally for their research and are currently involved in a variety of research projects in the UK, across Europe and globally. Key courses include LL.M in Commercial Law/International and European Law/International Legal Studies, MA in International Criminology and MA in Biotechnological Laws and Ethics.

English Literature, Language and Linguistics

The School of English has a national and international reputation and offers research expertise in all of the major areas of English Literary study, in a stimulating and supportive environment. Key courses include MA in Applied Linguistics, MA in English Language and Literature, MA in American Literature and MA in International Cinema.

History

The Department of History is one of the most active centres for teaching and historical research in the UK, offering expert teaching and supervision in a wide range of areas stretching from late antiquity to the late

twentieth century. Key courses include MA in Historical Research, MA in Twentieth-Century History, MA in American History and MA in International History.

Geography

Founded in 1908, our Department of Geography is one of the oldest departments of its kind in the country. It enjoys a long-standing international reputation for academic research by staff in a wide range of areas within human and physical geography and this has been recognised by the award of several major competitive research grant. Key courses include MA in Human Geography Research and MA in Social and Cultural Geographies.

Archaeology

The Department of Archaeology one of the largest Archaeology Departments in the country and aims to develop archaeological research by drawing upon the integrated strengths of the humanities, and the natural and physical sciences. Key courses include MA in Archaeology, MA in Material Culture Studies, MSc in Environmental Archaeology and Palaeoeconomy, MSc in Human Osteology and Funerary Archaeology and MSc in Palaeoanthropology, which is unique to the UK.
