"To enable intellectually distinguished young Americans, who will become their country's future leaders and decision makers, to study in the UK





Changes for 2021 Competition

Personal statement reduced to 750 words from 1,000

Future plans question reduced to 150 words from 300

3 letters of recommendation instead of four:

- One preferred recommender
- One general (but academic)
- One focused on leadership

New question on the impact of COVID-19 on the applicant (150—word answer)

New question in endorsement letter on university's policies during COVID-19 pandemic

Students asked to provide employment and personal interests and dates

5 TIPS FOR CHOOSING A UK UNIVERSITY

DO YOUR RESEARCH

Why you chose to apply to a university matters greatly to selection committees. Conduct thorough research on programmes in your academic field & choose a school you believe will best support your academic & professional goals.

TALK TO UK PROFESSORS

UK universities are home to some of the world's leading researchers & professors. Consider reaching out to professors for information, advice or to seek assistance in developing a research plan.

CONSIDER OUTSIDE LONDON/OXBRIDGE

The best programme for your interests might not always be found in London, Oxford or Cambridge. Many other UK universities can provide a tailored academic experience and allow you to discover everything that makes British culture so unique.

DEVELOP AN ACADEMIC PLAN

Develop a plan that demonstrates in your application (and to the selection committees) how you plan to make the most of your time in the UK.

REMEMBER, YOU CAN APPLY ANYWHERE

The Marshall Scholarship enjoys partnership agreements with a host of British universities and colleges who will subsidize or cover the full costs of a scholarship. This effectively allows you to apply for any university in the country. The more that Marshall Scholars go to partners schools, the more scholarships we are able to offer on a yearly basis.




